IN THE MATTER of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act
2012

AND

IN THE MATTER of an application by
THE 4T CLUB (2022) LIMITED
for the renewal of an on-licence

DECISION OF THE MANAWATU DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE (ON THE PAPERS)

This application was considered by the Manawatu District Licensing Committee pursuant to the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

Application

THE 4T CLUB (2022) LIMITED has applied for the renewal of an on-licence in respect of premises situated at 43 Eyre Street, Feilding and known as 4T Club.

Inquiring Agency Reports

Police

The New Zealand Police do not oppose the application.

Licensing Inspector

A report from the Manawatu District Council Licensing Inspector dated 18 January 2024 was received and considered. The Inspector did not oppose the application.

Medical Officer of Health

The Medical Officer of Health does not oppose the application.

Local Alcohol Policy

There is no local alcohol policy in force within the Manawatu district.

Consideration of the application

As no objection to the application has been filed and no matters of opposition have been raised by the inquiring agencies, the application was considered on the papers.

In considering whether to renew the on-licence, the licensing committee considered the criteria set out in section 131 of the Act.

District Licensing Committee decision

*Having regard to the information supporting the application and having regard to the criteria set out in section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the Manawatu District Licensing Committee grants the renewal of an on-licence to **THE 4T CLUB (2022) LIMITED** in respect of premises situated at 43 Eyre Street, Feilding and known as 4T Club, for a period of three years expiring on the 23rd day of November 2026, subject to the following conditions:*

1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not—
(i) present on the premises to dine.
2. Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 10.00 a.m. to 1.00 a.m. the following day
3. The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages.
4. The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
5. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
6. The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
7. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times when open for the sale of alcohol. If full a la carte menu or buffet meals are not available then a minimum of four types of light meals must be available (excluding nuts, chips and the like) Menus and the availability should be clear to customers and food should be actively promoted.
8. The entire premises is designated as a 'Supervised' area.
9. Drink water must be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business.
10. The area where alcohol is to be sold and consumed is described in the plan date stamped as received by the District Licensing Committee on 7 November 2023 and no alcohol is to be taken out of this area.
11. A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from Eyre Street is designated as the principal entrance.
