IN THE MATTER of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012
AND
IN THE MATTER of an application by
JOHNSTON PARK BOWLING CLUB INCORPORATED
for the issue of a special licence

DECISION OF THE MANAWATU DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE (ON THE PAPERS)

This application was considered by the Manawatu District Licensing Committee pursuant to the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

Application

JOHNSTON PARK BOWLING CLUB INCORPORATED has applied for a special licence to provide alcohol sales. The application relates to a formal dinner with a guest speaker to fundraise for the Bowling Club.

Inquiring Agency Reports

Police

The New Zealand Police do not oppose the application.

Licensing Inspector

A report from the Manawatu District Council Licensing Inspector dated 31 August 2023 was received and considered. The Inspector does not oppose the application.

Medical Officer of Health

The Medical Officer of Health does not oppose the application.

Local Alcohol Policy

There is no local alcohol policy in force within the Manawatu district.

Consideration of the application

As no objection to the application has been filed and no matters of opposition have been raised by the inquiring agencies, the application was considered on the papers.

In considering whether to issue a special licence, the licensing committee considered the criteria set out in section 142 of the Act.

District Licensing Committee decision

Having regard to the information supporting the application and having regard to the criteria set out in section 142 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the Manawatu District Licensing Committee grants the issue of a special licence to JOHNSTON PARK BOWLING CLUB INCORPORATED in respect of the event for which the licence was sought, subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours:
Saturday, 14 October 2023 4.30 p.m. to 11.30 p.m.

2. The licensee must display a copy of this special licence at the point of sale so as to be easily read by people attending the event.
3. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times, within the licensed area, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed.
4. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed.
Signage at the bar, staff to check ID, staff to monitor for minors and intoxicated persons, minors and intoxicated persons will not be served alcohol.
5. Drinking water must be freely available at the bar and dining area while the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol.
6. Substantial food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times alcohol is being sold or supplied and similar to that detailed in the application.
7. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises including but not limited Speights Mid Ale, DB Export Citrus, Monteiths mid strength and Heineken low alcohol beers.
8. Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises including but not limited orange juice, soft drinks, ginger beer.
9. A telephone must be freely available for customers to call for transport and staff must assist if required. Telephone numbers for alternative forms of transport from the premises must be displayed.

Duration

This licence is in force from **4.30 p.m. to 11.30 p.m., Saturday, 14 October 2023.**
