Minutes of the Sanson Community Committee held in the Supper-room on Wednesday 10th June 2020.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and passed as correct. Grant/Christine.

Business Arising;
Bus Shelter.

N.Z.T.A. has said that there is no room to put a bus shelter as footpaths are too narrow.

Andrew spoke about Del's submission and the reception that it achieved. Problems to obtain a bylaw preventing truck drivers using the back streets to avoid the Junction corner. Pam Workman's culvert in Hedges St is too narrow and she will contact Council to have it widened. Flooding of properties in wet weather will be addressed. All in all, not much progress. But drainage issues are having plans drawn up at the present time.

With N.Z.T.A's footpath subsidy in the near future, this may mean more footpaths for Sanson's back streets.

Council Report.

Janine spoke about the money allocated to Sanson for improvements. Community funds are \$8361.43 and Planning fund \$5000. Members are agreed that the security cameras at school, hall, swimming pool etc. need to be upgraded and this money could go towards this. Grant to get project forms. Janine also told us of the \$1000 offered from Council to put on a post covid19 party for residents.

Andrew spoke about the 10 year plan currently being discussed and the four main subjects being earthquake noncompliant buildings, climate change, community housing and roading issues. It is out now for comments and will be in effect next year.

Andrew spoke about the scheme to take waste water from the district to Feilding and the progress being made.

General Business;

Denise has resigned from both the Community Committee and the market committee. Her resignation has been accepted Leona/Christine. Since Kristi resigned as secretary the committee has been without one. Del has been filling in on a very temporary basis.

Market Report.

Christine read the market report. The market hasn't functioned since the lockdown in March and now that the hotel building has been demolished that site is too messy to trade on. In the meantime Caroline Smith has opened a boot sale type market on the Motel's part of the gravelled carpark. Property owner has stated to Grant that he is keen for the Community Market to go ahead once site is cleared. At a meeting of market members it was agreed that the market goes into recess for six months. This is contingent on getting enough help to run the market. Christine has resigned as Market manager and will stay on as treasurer. She will be responsible for dealing with Charities Commission for the Hall and Market which are now both in the hands of the Community Committee. Market account stands at \$27,284.06 It was agreed that \$3000.00 held in this account donated by Denise towards bus shelters, be returned to her.

Hall report;

Bank Account stands at \$4387.87 as at 31st May. Several bookings were cancelled during the lockdown but bookings are picking up again and the hall is well used. Jennifer Berquist is liaising with Del and will eventually take over the running of the hall. In the meantime things are going well.
